Rick Dove has been Waterkeeper Alliance's Southeast Representative since July 2000, and was previously Waterkeeper for the Neuse River in North Carolina, one of the nation's centers of industrial livestock agriculture. Dove practiced civilian law for many years, and commercially fished the Neuse River.

As the Neuse River's long-standing spokesperson, Rick has been in more than 4000 news stories in both major and local media, and his work was detailed in a chapter of the Simon and Schuster book, *And the Waters Turned to Blood*.
